1. IMPACT OF CLIMATE DRIVEN NATURAL CALAMITIES ON CHRONIC DISEASES AND DISABILITY IN A GLOBAL WEEK TO ACT ON NCDs AND SDGs



NUMS Department of Public Health (DPH) conducted Global Week for Non-Communicable Diseases (NDCs) and UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) from 15 August to 5 September 2022. The advocacy event on September 5, marked the end of the awareness and health promotion Campaign. Prof. Dr. Uzma Hassan, Head of Department Public Health, speaking on the subject said that the youth-led activity is to mark the inextricable interconnections between health, chronic diseases, and sustainable development. Cardiovascular diseases, chronic respiratory disease, cancers, diabetes, and mental health problems are constantly on the rise and these major groups of NCDs (also called chronic diseases) account for 77% of all NCD deaths in Low-and middle-income countries like Pakistan.

Dr. Hina Shan, Assistant Professor DPH and Focal Person of NUMS to NCD Alliance (NCDA) highlighted flash floodings have caused massive socioeconomic constraints and afflicted health systems with the ongoing impacts of COVID-19. According to the latest statistics by the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA) the devastating floods have affected 3.6 million acres of crops, killed 750k livestock, and 1.69 million houses have been destroyed worsening the fragile humanitarian situation of people. NCDs have socioeconomic implications with physical and psychological strains requiring shared responsibility and multisectoral action to scale up and accelerate action NCDs.

Awareness regarding Resistance of Antibiotics and Bacteria

05 Students from AFPGMI-AHS have participated in a competition of "Spreading Awareness regarding anti-biotic misuse and resistance" conducted by NUMS on 26th of November, 2021 under the theme of NUMS-World Antimicrobial Awareness week (WAAW). They have won the competition with a distinction of overall First prize.



World Immunization Week as a Practical Learning Activity




World Immunization Week, April 24 to 30th, serves a great opportunity to create awareness among people to learn more about how to protect against vaccine preventable disease. The aim of celebrating this is to promote the use of vaccines to protect people of all ages against disease. Immunization is widely recognized as one

of the world's most successful health interventions. Immunizing children can avert up to 17pc of childhood mortality in Pakistan thus help contribute towards achieving Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 3 on reducing child morbidity and mortality. Diseases with higher transmissibility like measles and polio pose a much higher risk to hit back strongly. Moreover, associated morbidity and mortality further intensify the burden on health system. This year WHO theme for world immunization week is 'Vaccines bring us closer'

The NUMS Department of Public Health conducted practical learning activity on Wednesday April 28th, 2021 with its students and faculty. The goal was to create engaging public awareness and

Education material around immunization so as to promote importance of vaccination in improving the health and wellbeing of everyone, everywhere. Students presented video and poster projects, highlighting vaccine mechanism, myths around vaccine, benefits of vaccination, risk of non-immunization and schedule of EPI program.

The students from Ibadat International University, University of Lahore (Islamabad campus), COMSATS University, CUST, Health Services Academy (HAS), PMAS-ARID Agriculture University, RIPHA international University have actively participated in different competition organized at NUMS. The highlights of the event were talk by

renowned clinical experts, basic scientists and field experts, student's oral presentation competition, role play, poster exhibition and competition, video screening competitions.

Capacity Building on Good Health & Well-Being Aspects

Hands-on Training Workshop on Real-Time PC

Skill enhancement of the personnel in the areas lying at the intersection of biomedical research and healthcare practices is the need of the hour to bridge the gap between research and practice. Keeping this in view, a two-day Hands-on training workshop on Real-Time PCR was organized by the Department of Biological Sciences, NUMS in collaboration with Sure Biodiagnostics and Quaid-i- Azam University, at the NUMS PWD campus. A cohort of 25 researchers/academicians and professionals attended this hands-on training workshop, which included practical aspects of qPCR including RNA extraction, cDNA synthesis, assay designing, and data analysis.



The lecture part consisted of a detailed overview and theoretical knowledge of the Real-time PCR technique and experiment design. Moreover, data acquisition and analysis were also thoroughly demonstrated by the instructors. The event was sponsored by Sure Biodiagnostics, a leading company dealing in scientific equipment and laboratory items.

China CDC MODPAD-MOV 2021 training Program

Faculty from NUMS Department of Biological Sciences participated in the four-day ModPad-MoV 2021



training program about Molecular Diagnosis, Pathogen Determination and Molecular Vaccinology Techniques, organized by China CDC (Chinese Center for Disease Control and Prevention).

The aim of the training program was to facilitate/improve the laboratory capacities of NUMS in conducting molecular

detection assays and implementing molecular diagnosis and vaccine development for the potential microbial pathogens which will help to establish linkages between China CDC and NUMS and scaling up laboratory capacities for prevention and control of pandemic and epidemic-prone diseases in Pakistan in close collaboration with chines experts.

Participation in World Microbe Forum Sponsored By Health Security Partners

Dr. Wasim Sajjad Assistant Professor Department of Biological Sciences, NUMS attended World Microbe Forum which was sponsored by Health Security Partners USA. Dr. Wasim Sajjad was been selected to receive the Bill and Melinda Gates Abstract Award for Scientists from Low-Middle and Low Income Countries to assist in covering registration expenses to attend World Microbe Forum, *June 20-24, 2021*, a joint digital between American Society for Microbiology (ASM-2021) and Federation of European Microbiological Societies (FEMS-2021).

Workshop on Healthcare Quality Assurance



Healthcare has become a chief concern around the world these days. Thus, there is a growing demand to understand healthcare businesses in order to guarantee quality services to patients. When casualties walk into a healthcare facility, the staff needs to see beyond broken bones, torn flesh, and busted organs; the patients bring not only medical challenges but also natural expectations to be cared for with respect, equality, and quality from the healthcare deliverers.

NUMS perceptively identified the need to address the topic of healthcare quality assurance with respect to the UN SDGs 3, 4, and 17. It thought-out an ingenious workshop on 'Healthcare Quality Assurance' on 17th June 2022 facilitated by Manager Quality Assurance, NUMS Ms. Sumiya Nauman (CSSGB, CPHQ, and the focal person for NUMS' Impact Rankings by THE).

Quality is never an accident; it is always the result of high intention, sincere effort, intelligent direction, and skillful execution. She methodically explained how to use Deming's 14 points to sustain and improve overall quality by giving dailv life examples. Ms. Sumiya shed ample light on the three aspects of quality - namely measureable quality, prospective quality, and appreciative quality - by dishing out relevant healthcare examples. She italicized the importance of quality management principles, explicitly pinpointing leadership commitment as the key due to its trickledown effect. She also described the SPO Paradigm i.e., Structure + Process = Outcome.

Based on the fact that quality is everybody's job, the resource person revealed that Quality Assurance Department has evolved to be a Quality Resource Center.

NUMS Pakistan in collaboration with Ege University, Turkey is organized a two-day hands-on workshop on identification of sand-fly and diagnosis of Cutaneous Leishmaniasis

The main purpose of this workshop was to provide deep theoretical knowledge as well as a chance to practically perform the preparation of NNN- media, microscopic identification of Leishmania parasite, extraction of DNA from the lesion aspirates, and sand-fly identification.



Khud Ko Pehchaano-Training Of Trainers At NUMS As Part Of Youth Engagement Program By GSM

National University of Medical Sciences (NUMS) and Green Social Marketing (GSM), Pakistan had signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU), to jointly implement a Youth Awareness Program called 'Khud ko Pehchano", funded by Punjab Population Innovation Fund (PPIF) and Population Welfare Department (PWD), Punjab, on August 17, 2022. The aim of this program is to create social awareness on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), gender-based violence, premarital counselling, benefits of birth spacing and authentic information about modern contraceptives.

In order to attain set targets laid down above, 20 nominated master trainers from NUMS were trained



through a formal training session on Oct 26, 2022, who will further train 400 NUMS' students on the mentioned topics.

The key training topics included the following:

- Basic knowledge about Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR)
- Premarital Counseling
- Healthy timing and spacing of pregnancy (HTSP)
- Modern methods of contraception
- Myths and misconceptions about family planning
- Gender Based Violence & mitigation strategies

The training was interactive and participants shared their experiences and best practices. A 'Fish Bowl Activity' ensured inclusion of all participants, generated interest in the topic and helped develop indepth understanding of the topics.

Participation in a course on School HEALTH SERVICES AT Integrated Health Services, Isb

NUMS Department of Public Health provides students innovative, experienced based and life changing education. A memorandum was signed between Integrated Health Services (IHS) and Department of Public Health, National University of Medical Sciences (NUMS). A group of twelve students from Public Health Department of NUMS participated in a week-long Certificate Course on school health services, from 19th September 2022 to 23rd September 2022, organized by School Health Department of



Integrated Health Services (IHS). The objective of this course was to provide knowledge, develop positive attitudes, and strengthen decision making skills and to equip with the practical on ground orientation and hands-on experience in the community health. The main emphasis was given to health issues aligning with the SDG "Ensure Healthy lives and Promote Well-being for all Ages".

The DPH students were encouraged to be a part of this project by the faculty of Public Health. During the course NUMS students were briefed by the Health Manager of IHS about the objectives, survey, data collection and comprehensive report writing. Then students were assigned the tasks to develop questionnaires and community mobilization material such as posters, flash cards etc. They also prepared communication strategies and conducted small awareness sessions related to physical activities, waste management, and prevention of waterborne diseases. As a part of course requirement, they visited the schools in the near community and conducted the survey encompassing the condition



of water, sanitation and hygiene assessment. Additionally, to assess the health status students also performed the nutritional assessment of the school children by measuring height and weight as well as by calculating BMI. Furthermore, the faculty of Public Health gave a lecture on drug abuse to provide awareness regarding the detrimental effects of drugs to the youth. After completing the survey, NUMS student jointly formulated comprehensive group reports and, based thereupon, presented it. It was greatly appreciated by IHS doctors and Public Health Consultants as these were comprehensively covering all aspects of the assigned topics.

Participation at INTERNATIONAL VACCINE INSTITUTE (IVI) SEOUL, KOREA

The International Vaccine Institute (IVI) is a nonprofit International Organization initiated by United Nations Development Program (UNDP) devoted to new vaccines for global health, and is headquartered in Seoul, Republic of Korea. After its establishment in 1997, the IVI has initiated training course on vaccinology annually. Each time, the IVI selected ten fellows based on their novel work in the field of vaccine science to participate in their annual vaccinology course. Dr. Muhammad Tariq Navid, Assistant Professor in the Department of Biological Sciences, National University of Medical Sciences in Rawalpindi, Pakistan represented Pakistan as IVI Fellow. Dr. Navid is working on vaccine development in Pakistan. He has developed novel Rabies recombinant vaccines



while staying at State Key Laboratory for Agricultural Microbiology, P.R. China. Dr. Navid has awarded 13 million grant from Higher Education of Pakistan (HEC) for remodeling of foot and mouth disease (FMD) vaccine in Pakistan through novel recombinant strategies. In recognition of his work on vaccine development, Dr. Navid was invited by IVI to participate in this specialized event. Lead representatives from various global dynamic institutions were the part of

this IVI's event. This representation has opened new horizons for international linkages and collaborations with reputed organizations for the NUMS-Pakistan.

NUMS Faculty Visited Qarshi Industries to Explore Potential Areas of Collaboration

A team of faculty members from the Sections of Phytochemistry and Natural Product Research and Biotechnology visited Qarshi Industries, Hattar, Haripur on September 19, 2022 to explore the areas of mutual interest in order to establish collaboration between the two institutions.

Qarshi is one of the top herbal industries in Pakistan, manufacturing more than 300 products. Apart from its prestige in product manufacturing from indigenous resources, Qarshi has ongoing research and development (R&D) activities in herbal materials standardization, including DNA barcoding, medicinal plant gardening supported by herbarium, seed bank and tissue culture facilities, and product development laboratories.

At the Qarshi Industry, NUMS Scientists were warmly welcomed and briefed about the existing product lines and future research programs. At the meeting, both sides deliberated on how a discovery/innovation at NUMS can be put use at industry through collaboration. The areas of mutual interest identified include, possibility of working on joint research on new product development, plant cell culture, funding and placement of MS/PhD students at Qarshi for their research work and training the manpower and help establish research facility. Later, NUMS team visited Qarshi Herb Garden,

various laboratories and also met with the staff and scientists working there.

The NUMS team from Phytochemistry and Natural Products Research was represented by Dr. Aman Karim, Dr. Sayed Afzal Shah, Dr. Nosheen Akhtar, Dr. Irum Mushtaq, from Biotechnology Dr. Muhammad Adil, and Microbiology was represented by Dr. Saeed Ahmad.

The team from Qarshi Industry was represented by Mr. Muhammad Imran (Head of the Qarshi Research International), Dr. Nasir Hayat Khan (In-charge, Department of Product Process Innovation), Mr. Rashid Afzal (Manager Horticulture) and Dr. Shafi Ullah (Senior Scientific Officer, Quality Control, Publications and Research).




the recipient but also serves the donor, both physically as well as psychologically. under the umbrella of community services of "Red Ray".

Selection of NUMS faculty for TWAS-2021 Innovation and Science Diplomacy Event

Dr. Hussain Mustatab Wahedi from the NUMS Department of Biological Sciences has been selected for the highly competitive TWAS – 2021 Innovation and Science Diplomacy Workshop held from **9**th **to 13**th **of August 2021**. This event is part of the series of TWAS Regional Workshops on Science Diplomacy, aimed at introducing science diplomacy and innovation diplomacy key concepts and issues to the bright young scientists from all over the world. A total of 143 young scientists from around the world and only two from Pakistan have been selected for this prestigious event.



The Competitive Technology Transfer Support Fund (TTSF) Grant From HEC

Dr Mahwish Ali, Assistant Professor NUMS Department of Biological Sciences wins a grant from HEC worth 8.2 Million PKR. This project titled "Development of efficient Biological water purification systems for industrial wastewater" awarded under HEC-TTSF grants scheme, the first towards step commercialization of this technology for industries. This project will provide a solution for a national issue and help the government to achieve SDG-6 "Clean Water and Sanitation". Moreover, by the implementation of this technology the end-user will not only meet the National Environmental Quality Standards of wastewater discharge but also get the benefit of reusing the treated water for gardening, toilet flushing and agriculture.

Distinction at Stanford University

NUMS Asst. Prof Dr Adnan Haider, Department

of Biological Sciences keeps to be among 2% cited authors for 3rd consecutive year. His research



focuses on the development of metal nanoparticles, synthesis of biopolymer composites, and electrospun nanofibers for biomedical and environmental applications. Dr. Haider has published a total of 73 high quality articles including book chapters. Additionally, he is the editor of several books on his field of specialization.

Stanford University, USA in collaboration with Elsevier publishes a list of top 2% cited authors every year. We are proud that Dr Adnan Haider's name has appeared for the third 3rd consecutive year in the list of 2022. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community Project for Well-Being

NUMS RED RAY (NR2) Project

In 2020, at the crucial time period of COVID-19, students from Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences dare to initiate a community service program titled NUMS Red Ray which is lately joined by NUMS Department of Psychology students, under the mentorship of Lecturer Clinical Psychology,

The incubation period of the program was marked with the individual efforts and donations followed by the congregation of students, the common interest to serve the cause of blood donation. The program not only engages volunteers for donation but also facilitates transportation services for those who have mobility issues. The members allocated as student ambassador of different organization at NUMS, are given opportunities to organize awareness sessions as well as blood donation camps.

The mission statement of this program is to work for the cause of blood donation to our vulnerable fellow beings who require blood transfusion for their survival and sustenance. Blood donation is a sacred act which can contribute to save precious lives, one donation can save up to three precious lives. The activities in NK2 is led by student leader in different domains, i.e., Medical Social Worker, Public Health Social Worker and Mental Health Social Worker. Initially students participated individual donation but later on the students of NUMS collaborated and worked together to improve and enhance their outreach. Blood camps were organized for specific disease as well as for rare blood group types. Online counseling has been offered to individuals who are with different phobias. At the instances where direct blood donation is not feasible the members play their part in expanding networking so that other donors can receive the news and can contribute to donation.

During the pandemic too, not only blood, but members worked for the cause of plasma donation to save the lives of those struggling with the Covid-19 complications. This civic engagement not only encouraged maximum participation in humanitarian cause but also facilitate them learning new life skills. NR2 is in process of opening NUMS Blood Bank at AFIT. So, far NK2 team successfully facilitated 80 direct beneficiaries, around 104 indirect beneficiaries (General population) and 100 plus donors.



Online Counselling Session


